2008 / 2009 SEASON REFLECTION

SNOWCREST RIDERS 1ST TO OPEN TRAILS in DISTRICT 7

Lots of snow arrived early, and the challenge was on. The deep snow arrived before frost had set in to the ground. Trees and branches covered our trails once again as they were snapped due to the heavy wet snow. Our Club snowmobiles could not make it very far packing without getting stuck or burning off drive belts. We decided to try something different.

With several off season modifications to improve the reliability of our small groomer, we brought it out for the test. Our small groomer known as the Scot-Trac was sent out minus its drag. The Scot managed quite well in the deep wet snow. Close behind was our New Holland TS110 tractor with the drag in tow. This worked very well. When the Scot-trac would get stuck, the TS110 was close behind to pull it out, so they could continue down the trail. There were some areas that we had to let set or freeze up, before the 8 tonne TS110 attempted to cross. By using our equipment in this manner we were able to get some of our main trails open early. Some such as C101D from Gravenhurst to Torrance, were open almost one month early compared to previous years. We're not sure if we were just lucky in some spots, but if necessary we'll try it again.

Keep in mind, extreme caution must be used by our groomer operators when working in these conditions. A few of our neighboring Clubs ran in to some major problems when their groomers sunk and were stuck in wet areas. Sinking a groomer can cause grooming downtime, major damage to the groomer with restoration costing in to the tens of thousands of dollars (your permit money), not to mention damaged and closed trails.

Once some of our main trails were open and we had established a good base, the Scot-Trac was given a maintenance check and sent to its intended destination of trail 15 and 4 in the southern part of our area. This was the first time in years that trails 15 and 4 had seen an industrial size groomer. In the recent past, these trails have been groomed with a small skip or blade drag pulled behind a snowmobile. After the Scot-Trac had made a few passes on these trails, the e-mails and phone calls started coming in. We received several calls from people, telling us that these trails were in the best shape in 10 plus years.

The Snowcrest Board of Directors recognized the importance of trail 15, and that a high volume of traffic uses this trail. The Board made a commitment to improve conditions on trail 15. The Scot-trac was purchased in 2005 for our smaller feeder trails but experienced major problems due to poor design. Snowcrest's new Board of Directors would not give up on the Scot-Trac. In the off season, we redesigned drive shafts so they wouldn't continue to break, and lengthened the tracks two inches to reduce stress on the axles. We also modified our old Bombi drag by reducing the size thus, creating less stress on the Scot-Trac. It appears some good thought, a little money and some work paid off.

Once again, we experienced wet and mild weather in January. Trails were closed and sledders asked to stay off until conditions improved. Some sledders continued to ride on closed trails causing damage that we were trying to avoid. Clubs at times will close trails during mild weather, in order to preserve the base that they have. Riding trials at this time will destroy the base. When weather conditions do improve, the trail may need days or weeks of grooming just to get the trails back to the condition they were in before the mild weather arrived. Fortunately, only a few riders chose to ignore our request, so damage was limited. It was only a short wait, and the trails were open once again.

SNOWCREST RIDERS SNOWMOBILE CLUB SAFETY POLICY

Snowcrest Riders Snowmobile Club will manage its operations and maintain a healthy and safe workplace for all persons, including meeting or exceeding legislation.

Safety was a major focus for 2008 / 2009, and will continue. Four more of Snowcrest volunteers took part in a chainsaw safety course paid for by the Club. Another five sets of chainsaw safety equipment was purchased, continuing our commitment to safety for our volunteers.

This past fall, our Club President prepared and presented a five hour safety seminar to over seventy groomer operators from OFSC District 7 at the Riverside Inn in Bracebridge. Our District now has a Safety Policy, equipment check sheets, and Safe Operating Procedures for most functions / processes performed by our 11 Clubs in the District. We received very positive feedback on the material, and presentation from the groomer operators of District 7.

What's New with Permits?

The OFSC has introduced a "Classic Permit"* for the 2010 season. Snowmobiles 15 years or older will be eligible for this permit at a cost of \$125.00, before or after December 1. For sled owners that have snowmobiles in this age group, this is a good thing. For families that can't afford new sleds but have older ones that they haven't been able to afford to permit, this is good news. The bad news: They will only be available at the District level, so only the District Office in Bracebridge will be permitted to sell them. MTO has approved these permits for this year only as a trial basis and depending on how well it goes, a decision will be made for the 2011 season. For your shopping convenience, if you go to the District office to pick up one of these permits, Snowcrest Riders Seasonal Permits will be available for you to purchase from District. Just remember to tell them at District that you support Snowcrest Riders Snowmobile Club. The regular seasonal permits will only be available at the District Office when you purchase a "Classic Permit". To do your normal permit shopping, you will still be able to get it from our office or one of our many distributors. Faxing and phoning your order in is still available. And introducing this year, OFSC has introduced on-line Permit sales.

Starting this season, you will be able to purchase your permit online* from Snowcrest Riders Snowmobile Club through the OFSC web site! To better serve our customers, we are working on providing you with the most secure and private online 2010 permit sales possible, so please check after October 1, 2009 to buy your permit.

As always, we maintain BUY WHERE YOU RIDE, so the OFSC has made this easier with two possible ways to purchase online.

Go to snowcrestriders.com and click on purchase your permit here! There will be a direct link to the OFSC permit site and just follow the directions.

click permits, click on the map in the area that you ride....there will be a drop down list of all the Clubs in that District with the name of the Town/City to make it easier to find the Club you would like to support.

Your permit order will be processed by a Fulfillment House and they will guarantee your permit delivery in 7 days. For those riders who prefer the quick and easy online purchasing, this will be great! For those riders who do not have internet access or would prefer to purchase their permit from a friendly person, you will still be able to purchase your permit the "Old Fashion" way! Our Permit Distributors will still have permits; we will also be processing the permits in our Office by phone, fax or mail. While we understand that technology is great, we still believe that some sledders still prefer coming in to our office and chatting, getting to know our volunteers and giving their well-received input, thoughts and suggestions.

Snowcrest Riders believes in the "Grass-Roots" in Snowmobiling and while some will purchase online, we believe that a more personal approach in some cases is best. Over the last 5 seasons, I have learned to recognize some names that have been loyal to Snowcrest over the years and some of you have stepped up and volunteered for the Club (much appreciated). When a regular permit buyer comes in the office, it is nice to be able to put a face to a name that you see each year at permit time.

Presidents Report

Well I'm still here! Our Board of directors nominated and elected me for another two year term as your Club President at our 2009 AGM in June. I was also nominated and elected as Alternate OFSC Governor for District 7 by our District Board.

As a new President a little over two years ago, I stated "Our Club needed to be more involved with supporting the Community, needed increased social events, while maintaining a great working relationship with other Clubs in District 7. We also needed to be financially responsible to you our members".

At my first Board meeting as Club President, my first order of business was to make it perfectly clear to our Directors that to be successful; Snowcrest Riders Snowmobile Club must collectively as a Board makes the decisions that affect this organization. There has been more opinions heard, motions made, and positive progress made as a Board in the last two years, than there has been in the last several years, I am told. Concerns Re: On Line Permit Sales:

There are a few things you need to be aware of regarding online permit sales starting this year. Most OFSC Clubs count on revenue from early permit sales, to use for pre-season trail prep. This includes, purchasing trail signage, filling groomer fuel tanks, costs associated with clearing and prepping trails, final repairs to equipment, and the list goes on. **BE AWARE** that if you purchase your trail permit on line, Clubs **WILL NOT SEE ANY OF THIS MONEY FROM THE OFSC**, in time to put towards our pre-season trail prep. On line permit sales will most definitely have a negative impact to Clubs ability to have trails open and in good shape early. **IF YOU WANT YOUR PERMIT DOLLARS TO GO TO EARLY SEASON TRAIL PREP**, it is best to purchase your permits directly from the Club office or one of their permit distributors. Snowcrest Riders would not see any monies from online early permit sales until late December at best. **THIS IS TOO LATE!** Last season, we began grooming December 8th. This was after, trail signage had been purchased and installed trail prep had been completed, and equipment preventative maintenance was completed. This was for the most part, accomplished with monies from early permit sales being purchased from our office or our permit distributors.

I have very positive feelings about the future of Snowcrest Riders. We are definitely getting stronger and more involved. However, there is still more to do. As I have said before, we have identified and have plans in place for some of the work that we need to do. Some of these projects are quite large and costly. Therefore, your continued support through volunteering and purchasing of trail permits with our Club will be greatly appreciated. Some projects will also rely on Government and OFSC funding, as well as DFO, MNR, and landowner agreements. These improvements may not happen overnight, but I am committed to doing everything possible to make them happen ASAP. The Beaver Creek Bridge was one priority, and we will soon move on to the next.

**SNOWCREST RIDERS SUCCESSFUL IN BRIDGE FUNDING BID
PERSERVERENCE PAYS OFF**

BIG NEWS for 2010: For those who have had to experience the 4.5 kms of road running on Doe Lake Rd (D-Trail) the last four years, a renewed experience is about to begin. Snowcrest Riders funding application for Federal Government Funding, and matching Provincial Funding was approved. As a result we are very pleased to announce we will be replacing the bridge over Beaver Creek. The in-water work is scheduled to be completed by October 1, and the 240 foot steel bridge is to be constructed by December 1, 2009. We have some brushing and tree clearing to do, but after four years of trail closure, we expect this section of trail to be re-opened this season!!!

Our Club has worked on this project for over two years with the Federal and Provincial Governments, the MNR, DFO, Engineers, and the Town of Gravenhurst. After running in to a number of road blocks and previous funding requests rejected, they continued to persevere. They are elated that the hard work has paid off. This is something that is very positive for Snowcrest Riders, the Town of Gravenhurst, the Trans Canada Trails Association, the residents on Doe Lake road, and the numerous people who will enjoy this year round picturesque trail. ATV's are strictly prohibited on this trail, as part of the trail runs through a Conservation Reserve. Snowcrest Riders have obtained all approvals necessary, to manage this trail for snowmobile use.

It is the law in Ontario for recreational sleds* using OFSC Prescribed Snowmobile Trails to have and display a valid Snowmobile Trail Permit.
